



- <sup>22)</sup> Please comment on specific aspects of the course that need improvement:
- A review of quiz
- At the beginning of the class, professor would introduce us some news and background material about every chapter. It is good for us to know about some business and accounting at the real world. Sometimes this consumes time, and it takes about 30 minutes. I think that introduction is too long, and we don't have enough time to cover some topics and questions in the note, because some topics are difficult and I can't totally understand them just reading book such as errors in inventory and calculating fair value for exchanging land and building.
- Better review sessions that would actually help on the test. Very broad reviews and packets
- I think it would be more beneficial for Prof. Raval to spend more time going through examples. We spend a lot of time doing the work on our own which can be very challenging since the material is tough. I think I would have learned and understood the material better if the professor spent more time walking through examples.
- I think you teach this course really well. Just some of your work on the solutions to packets are confusing. I figure out simpler ways and just make sure we have the same answer.
- I would prefer that we were given less time to try to figure out a problem in a chapter which we had no idea how to figure out.
- It would be better if we got our tests back so that we could go over them
- Maybe a little less course load.
- More explanation on each chapter. We need more time in class.
- No improvements are necessary.
- None. Overall the course is set up in a way that helps students in various ways to learn the difficult material.
- On the exams all that was written was the number of points that had been deducted, no explanation as to what we did wrong.
- Only one guiz a week
- Personally i think the time given for the pop guizzes sometimes was little.
- So far I think the teacher did amazing job with preparing the lectures. He was including some very interesting up today news that were very helpful with the material that we were going to study or we had already covered in class.
- Spend more time talking about the material
- Taking 15-20 of each class to talk about other corporations is too much. Instructor could only get through half of the material this way and the rest we had to teach ourselves, which was most often the harder half of the material.
- The class time is not enough for the thorough understanding of the info covered. Not enough time for quizzes and tests. No time for covering the material in depth, which makes most of it being omitted. Not enough time to practice the problems. The pace is too fast for majority of students
- The course materials were very difficult to follow at times and more class time towards the materials would be helpful for the tests.
- The course was at a quick speed. Accounting is usually like that, but without a physical hard copy book, studying methods aren't as effective.
- The overall course was extremely difficult. It would make me second guess my major all the time based on how poorly I performed.
- The quizzes provided in class are so helpful but students need more time to do them. 5-8 minutes isn't enough time to go over an accounting question and understand what you are doing in the end.
- The way in which quizzes are administered. The begining half of the class gets the quiz first and immediately starts working on it, while the back half of the class gets the quiz last. Then once the last student gets the quiz the instructor put a time limit on the clock. All students should start every quiz at the same time.
